


Memories of the 'Brien'





Source: Marriage date of Charles O'Brien and Catherine Hussey: FHL online www.familysearch.org. Charles (2) was laid to rest at Aglish Cemetery, in a smaller grave beside his parents, along with his wife Catherine Hussey, his sister Bridget (Old Auntie Bridgie-not shown here), and his eldest son Charlie. Other family members, including the wife of Charles (3), Julia Keane, are buried at Killeentierna Cemetery, Currow, according to Sheila Watson. Sheila describes Aglish, where it seems both Catholics and Protestants are buried, as "at a beautiful place, Ballyhar, in a ruin of an old Protestant church." Sheila notes that Charles (4) died due to delayed surgery, Kathleen of kidney disease, Ellen (like her father) of heart failure, Sheila, William, and John of lung disease, and Hannah of Hodgkin's Disease. Data was recorded here in 2007.
