

MICHAEL FLEMING & THE BUTTER RUN

Extract from this book on the Flemings Coolick, Kilcummin - Michael Fleming, Blarney & The Butter Run.

seamus fleming Fleming Ancestral Trail Michael Fleming of Blarney, Co. Cork, m. a.MacCarthy of Killeentierna in 1775. Mr. MacCarthy, his wife's father, was in the habit of going to Cork Butter Market, and he used to stay in Michael Fleming's father's house. He took a fancy to Michael Fleming, the son of his host, and he made a "match" between him and his daughter and gave him his f. at Killeentierna. Their issue were – Michael, James, John, David, Thomas and Garret.

(The other sons of Old Michael Fleming of Blarney, David, Thomas and Garret never came to Kilcummin. Their descendants are very numerous in the parish of Killeentierna.)

Michael M. Fleming came as a cl. ist. to Inch and m. a girl named Kelly. They lived in Inch House, the present residence of Pat P. Fleming. Issue – three sons and three daughters.

All their sons and two of their daughters went to America.

Mary, one of the daughters m. in half of her f.f. Corney O'Leary of Milleen. For issue see page 84. (The remainder of the farm was given by the middleman, Ed. MacSweeney, to other tenants, and it is now believed that Michael died in the house afterwards occupied by the Teahens.)

James M. Fleming m. in Inch Farm a Moriarty and they had issue - John, Ellen, Nano, Margaret and Mary.

John James Fleming m. in his f.f. Jude Gallivan of Braehig, and had issue – James, John, Michael, Pat, Mary, Ellen and Nano.

James John Fleming, a cl. ist., m. Margaret Twomey of Tureencahill. Issue – John, Tom, Michael, James, Julia, Mary, Nano, Margaret and Ellen.

John, Michael, James, Nano and Ellen went to America.

Tom m. in his f.f. Nora O'Keeffe of Tureen, Co. Cork. Issue – Pat, Jack, Jim and Margaret all at home unm.

Julia m. Ned Counihan of Faha. Issue - John, Ned, Abbie and Mary.

John counihan lives in a labourer's cottage in his f.f. and works around as a tradesman.

Ned Counihan m. Elie Barry of Anabla in f.f. Issue – two boys and two girls. Abbie Counihan m. Michael Quirke who was a shopkeeper in Milltown. They have issue.

Mary Counihan, unm. lives with her mother.

Margaret James Fleming m. Michael Larkin of Milltown. Issue – Margaret who is at home unm.

Mary James Fleming m. Michael O'Riordan of Teinebioc (?) Issue - Pat and Margaret both unm. at home.

John John Fleming never m. He lives at Toremore. His farm is now in possession of his nephew, Jack.

Michael John Fleming m. in his f.f. Kate Doolin of Ballydwyer, Ballymacelligot. Issue - John, James, Tom, Julia, Hannah.

John M. Fleming m. in his uncle John's f. at Toremore Mary Lynch of Annaghilamore. Issue – Michael, Con, Hannah and Sheila.

Michael is a chemist's assistant in Killarney. Sheila is a nurse in England. Con and Hannah are at home unm.

James M. Fleming m. in half his f.f. at Inch Ellen Cronin of Knockachorrin. Issue - Michael, John, Catherine, Julia and Margaret.

Michael died at home when a young man. John and Margaret are at home unm. Julia is a nun in Kilkenny, Catherine is m. in America.

Tom M. Fleming M.C.C. m. in half his f.f. at Inch Kathleen Kelly of Tournanonagh. Issue – Michael, Pat, Tom, Dan, Kate, Janie and Sheila.

Michael and Tom are Christian Borthers. Sheila is a nun.

Janie is working in England. (nurse in St. Finans). The rest are at home unm. (1936) Julia M. Fleming m. Tom Murphy of Baloochtra, Milltown. She was his second wife and she died without issue.

Hannah M. Fleming is unm. and lives with Tom Murphy and takes care of Tom's children with his first wife.

Pat John Fleming died unm. in America.

Mary John Fleming m. John Daly of Dooneen. For issue see Dooneen.

Ellen John Fleming m. Murty Buckley of Faha. Issue – John, Larry, Pat, Michael, Murty, Jim, Jeremiah, Mary, Ellie, Nora and Julia (11).

John Buckley is an ex R.I.C. and unm.

Larry Buckley m. in one of his father's farms to a Lyne of Ballymalis, a sister of Father Lyne's who was C.C. at one time in Currow Parish. They have six or seven in family – all young.

Pat Buckley is m. near Millstreet to Pat Kearney's d. of Ballincarrig. They have issue. Michael Buckley m. in his f.f. at Keel, Faha, Cis Prendergast of Cahirdeen, Ballyhar. They have a large young family.

Murty Buckley is m. in Am. Jim Buckley is unm. and lives with his br. Larry at Faha. Jeremiah Buckley has a f. at Rockfield and is unm.

Mary Buckley is m. to Richard Shanahan of Castleisland. They have issue.

Ellie Buckley is m. to John O'Riordan of Listry, a farmer, and they have five or six in family.

Nora Buckley is m. at Ballybeggan of Tralee to a Scollard. They have six or more in family.

Julia Buckley is m. in America.

Nano John Fleming m. Tim Kerin of Gortglass. Issue – John, Con, Humphry, Tim, Bridget, Jim, Mary, Julia.

John Kerin is a Customs and Excise Officer in Cork. He is unm.

Con Kerin is working in Cork; unm.

Humphry Kerin m. in half his f.f. Bridget O'Sullivan of Mount, Scartaglen. They have five boys and two girls.

Tim Kerin m. in half his f.f. Mary Sheahan of Knockeenalicka. No issue.

Bridget Kerin is m. to Tom Prendiville of Braehig, a farmer. They have issue.

Jim Kerin died in U.S.A. Mary Kerin is a maternity nurse in Scartaglen, unm.

Julia Kerin, now dead, was m. to Arthur O'Brien of Knockmanagh. No issue.

Ellen James Fleming m Kean of Tullig, Castleisland. Issue – Mary, John, Ellie and Denis.

Mary Keane m. Batt Daly of Lyre, Currow. Issue – John, Jim, Ellie, Maurice, Nora, Batt and Denis.

John, Jim and Ellie went to Australia. Maurice Daly is m. in Cork and has issue. Mary Daly m. a Hamilton, ex R.I.C. They live in Cork and have issue.

Nora Daly m. a Ryan, an ex R.I.C. man. They also live in Cork and have issue. Hannah Daly is dead. She was m. to Michael O'Connor of Knockrour and had one issue – a d. this d. is m. to a Cremin of Knockeenahone. Issue.

Batt Daly is m. in half his f.f. to a Clifford of cloonts, Ballyhar. They have issue, all young.

Denis Daly m. in half his f.f. an O'Brien from Fieries. They have issue – all young. Ellen Kean m. Denis Brosnan of Tullig, Castleisland. Issue – Mrs. Thomas Prendiville, Killarney, who has issue. Her eldest d. is m. to Denis Counihan of High Street and has issue. Another d. is a nun. Others are at home unm.

Mrs. E. Meagher, High Street, Killarney. She has a large young family, all at home and unm.

Mrs. McElligott of Castleisland. They have issue. Mrs. T. H. Murphy of Castleisland.

Mrs. W. Costello of Castleisland. Mrs Costello whose husband is a chemist in Dublin. John Borsnan is m. in his f.f. and has issue. Maurice Brosnan is a priest in Australia.

Denis Keane had a public house in Hen St., Killarney. He m. Mary MacCarthy of Inchecullane. Issue – Maurice, John, Jim, Pat, Mary and Ellie.

All the boys went to America. (Maurice was a N.T. and taught for some years at Cahooreigh N.S. Killarney and resigned.)

Mary and Ellie work at the Imperial Hotel, Killarney. (Mrs. Kean sold her public house) John Kean m. in f.f. a Walsh from Springmount. Issue – Maurice and two girls.

Maurice Walsh m. a Kearney from Cordal. No issue up to 1936.

The two girls live in the old home. They own half their f.f. but Maurice manages the whole f.

Nano James Fleming m. John Lombard of Doolaig, Castleisland. Issue – Richard, Aeneas, John, James and Mary.

Richard and Aeneas Lombard went to America. John Lombard went to Australia. James Lombard m. in half his f.f. Catherine Fitzgerald of Cordal. Issue – three boys and three girls.

Richard Lombard m. in his f.f. an O'Sullivan from Farmer's Bridge. They have issue all young.

Nano Lombard m. Con Daly of Ballymacpierce. Issue – a boy and a girl. The four other members of James Lombard's family went to America.

Mary Lombard m. in half her f.f. Denis Reidy of BallymacElligott. Issue – Dan and 5 others. Dan Reidy m. Mary Fleming of Cumeenataggle in half his f.f. They have two girls and a boy, all unm. and at home.

The five other members of Denis Reidy family went to America.

Margaret James Fleming m. James O'Sullivan of Listry. Issue – one daughter, Ellen and Thady. Ellen O'Sullivan m. Denis O'Connor of South Hill, Killarney. Ellen sold her f.f. when she m. Issue – Denis and two girls.

Denis O'Connor was a carpenter and owned the School of Industry in Killarney which was originally founded by Lady Kenmare. Denis died a few years since. He was m. to Maggie Fleming d. of David Fleming of Port Road, Killarney and had issue – Jack and David, both of whom are clerks in the Post Office and unm.

Thady O'Sullivan was a ploughman in the Killarney M.H. till his death.

Mary James Fleming m. Pat Herlihy of Goulane. She died after having one son who afterwards went to America. Pat Herlihy m. secondly Jude Callaghan and with her he had a large family. John Michael Fleming, son of Michael of Blarney, came as a cl. ist. to Clydine and m. a Fleming there. They had one son, Michael, of whom an account is given under the townland of Clydine. (When giving an account of this Michael Fleming the Narrator stated that he was the first of his family to come to Clydine. This is not correct, for his father was there before him.)
